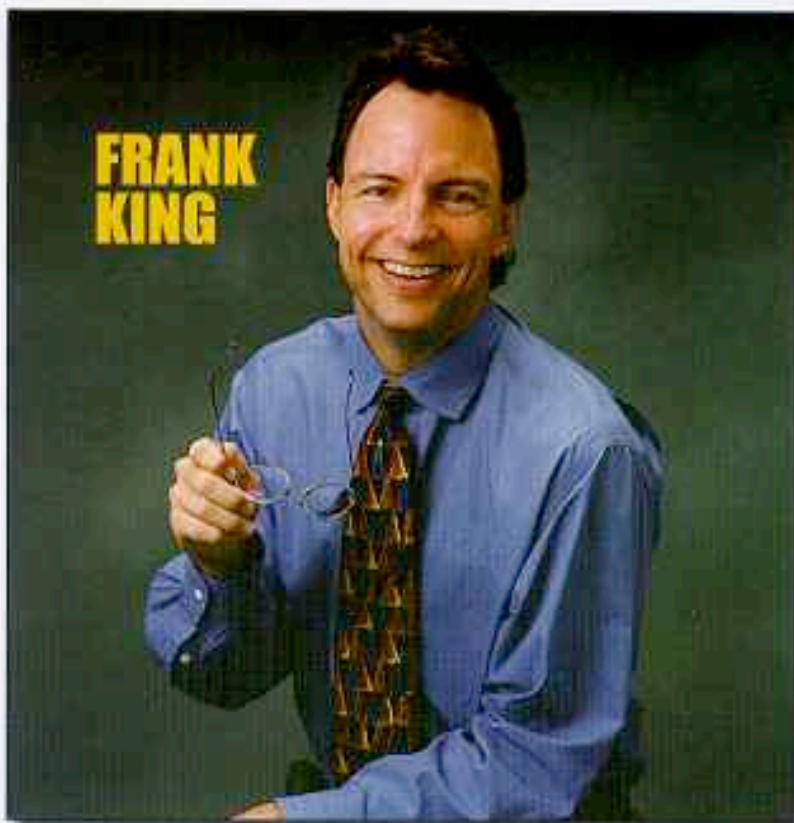


# 20 GREAT ACTS UNDER \$10K
